



Mayor Pro-tem Retires Councilmember Appointed



Longtime Troy City Councilmember and Mayor Pro-tem Harriet Prinz tendered her resignation to the Troy City Council at a May Special Called City Council meeting. Ms. Prinz retired from the City Council in that she has moved to Temple to be closer to family members.

Mayor Michael G. Morgan presented Ms. Prinz with an appreciation plaque at the June Council Meeting.

James Hicks was appointed by the Council to serve out the remainder of Ms. Prinz term. Councilperson Laurie Bailey was selected by the Council to serve as Mayor Pro-tem.

Local Option Election - Wine

A Local Option Liquor Election to authorize the sale of wine was conducted on May 6th. The election was called in response to a petition submitted by local residents. The petition was verified to contain the signatures of 106 qualified Troy voters meeting the requisites of Section 501.032 of the Texas Election Code (which requires that the petition be signed by at least 35% (95) of the number of voters that voted in the last gubernatorial election (271)).

The Local Option passed with 88% of the vote.

In an effort to insure a robust source of drinking water well into the future, the City of Troy has obtained funding from the Texas Water Development Board for a low interest loan to construct a new water well. Last year, Troy also extended its wholesale water agreement with the City of Temple for 30 years.

Bidding for the well project should conclude on August 24th with the bid awarded shortly thereafter.
